Caribbean

Campesino Committee of the Highlands (*Quixayá, San Lucas Tolimán, Guatemala*)

Canadian Partner: Maritimes-Guatemala Breaking the Silence Network

Work with an Indigenous, campesino organization to develop materials on climate change and its effects on campesino farmers. Collaboratively prepare and share materials and popular education opportunities for campesino farmers on topics like climate resilient farming practices, food sovereignty, water protection, and community displacement. Help to create advocacy materials, reports, and proposals about climate change impacts on campesino farmers to be presented to national and international organizations responsible for climate change mitigation efforts.

Mesoamerican Permaculture Institute (*San Lucas Tolimán, Guatemala*)

Canadian Partner: Maritimes-Guatemala Breaking the Silence Network

Support a Maya Kaqchikel permaculture center in their efforts to implement community gardens and provide workshops on food sovereignty, biodiversity, and reclaiming Kaqchikel (agri)cultural knowledge. Interns will help IMAP on a variety of projects, including helping with permaculture garden implementation and maintenance projects at the IMAP site and in the local community, relationship building during north-south exchanges and delegations, grant writing, communications efforts, and more.
